

Workshop on Providing Primary Care to Transgender Individuals

Rainbow Health Ontario in partnership with the Simcoe Muskoka District Health Unit, Orillia Soldiers' Memorial Hospital and the AIDS Committee of Simcoe County, are offering a workshop to physicians and nurse practitioners to increase community capacity to provide high quality primary care to transgender individuals.

Transgender is defined as a person whose gender identity is different from his or her biological sex, regardless of the status of surgical and hormonal gender reassignment processes. Transgender is often used as an umbrella term to include transsexuals, transgender, cross dressers, and two-spirit and intersex people.

The Williams Institute performed a survey in 2011 that estimated that approximately 700,000 people or 0.3% of the US population are transgender, which extrapolated to the Canadian population would be approximately 70,000 individuals.

The day-long workshop will be held in Orillia on Friday, January 30, 2015 and led by Dr. Blair Voyvodic, Family Physician and trans health experts Sue Hranilovic, Nurse Practitioner and Matt Caron Francino, MEd, Trans Health Connection Coordinator.

Topics covered will include:

- Providing holistic community-based primary care to trans clients
- Assessment, monitoring, and follow-up for hormone therapy
- Familiarizing yourself with other available community referrals
- Building a locally-relevant, integrated health system for trans clients
